

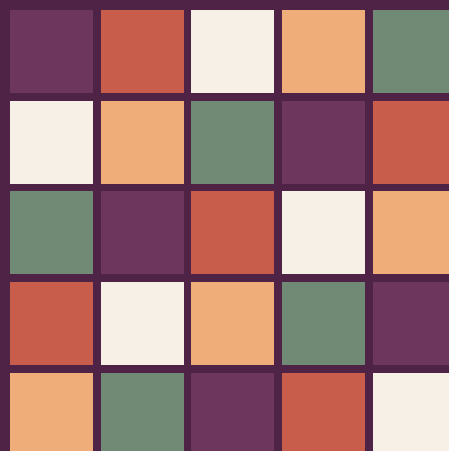

Identify

Name the actual cut and count the pieces in your pack.

2

Measure

Check whether the maker measures to the point or valley of pinked edges.

3

Match

Use a pattern written for that format whenever possible.

4

Verify

Treat conversions as shortlist tools, then follow the source cutting diagram.

WORKING RULE

Use this workbook to make and record decisions. When a current pattern, manufacturer, or service-provider instruction differs, follow that source.

Common precut reference

FORMAT	COMMON SOLD SIZE	PLANNING CAVEAT
Mini charm	2½ × 2½ in	Tiny pieces fray quickly
Charm square	5 × 5 in	Pinked edge convention varies
Layer cake	10 × 10 in	Pack counts vary
Strip roll	2½ in × WOF	Usable width varies
Honey bun	1½ in × WOF	Narrow seam accuracy matters
Fat eighth	Commonly 9 × 21 in	Alternate cuts exist
Fat quarter	About 18 × 21 in	Measure before tight layouts
